## **Part V:** Reminder of May in PA!

Traditionally, the south regions have hosted a National Professors of Middle Level Education Symposium in May. Last year the Legends of Middle School was sponsored in Georgia. This year the symposium was to be offered in Tennessee but was cancelled due to tight budgets and lack of enrollment. When elected as a future president, the hope was that the northern and eastern regions of the National Professors of Middle Level Education would become more involved. I thought this was the perfect opportunity to combine a number of organizations involved in middle level education and get the northern and eastern regions more engaged in NaPOMLE.

Next spring, the National Professors of Middle Level Education in cooperation with the Pennsylvania Professors of Middle Level education, the Shippensburg University School Study Council, and the Shippensburg Middle Level Collegiate Association will co-sponsor a symposium at Shippensburg University, Shippensburg, Pennsylvania. The scheduled dates are May 20 and May 21.

Each co-sponsoring organization will have a contribution: The Pennsylvania Professors of Middle Level Education will combine their annual symposium with the National and hold it at Shippensburg University; Brian Small and the Shippensburg University School Study Council will offer it's exemplary program display; the National and Pennsylvania Professors of Middle Level Education will offer a strand on the middle level research and best practice; and the Shippensburg University Collegiate Association will sponsor a strand on how to get a collegiate program started at colleges across our state and surrounding regional states.

Mark your calendars for May 20 and May 21. Come find out what local middle level school districts think is exemplary programs; take the opportunity to present best practice or research; learn how to set up a middle level collegiate association at your university; meet and talk with professors, teachers, school administrators, teaching interns and others associated with middle level instruction and curriculum.

Shippensburg University is located in the southern tip of central Pennsylvania situated right along route 81 which runs north and south. If you wish to extend your professional experience to a longer personal stay, Gettysburg Pa is only a half hour away; Washington D.C. and Baltimore are 2 hours away; Philadelphia is 3 hours and Pittsburg is 3.5 hours away.
